The Autumn 2023 meetings took place in Athens, from October 25th to October 27th. 71 attendees from 21 European countries gathered to discuss the latest information, hurdles, and developments on minor uses issues.



>>> CEG FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

In the session on Weeds of the CEG Fruits and Vegetables meeting, chaired by Mr. Peter Hartvig (Denmark), Mr. Matthias Eberius (representing the company <u>CropZone</u>) gave a presentation on the latest developments in hybrid herbicide technology.

Mr Hartvig reported the results of a survey of MUCF experts in several countries to identify alternatives to glyphosate in fruit and berries.

These two presentations highlighted potential future areas of work regarding weed control. They provided a broad information base to adapt weed management towards more IPM-oriented solutions.

Ms Theodora Nikolopoulou (Greece), chaired the CEG Vegetables (focus on Fungicide and Insecticide) for the first time. We thank her for her commitment in supporting this working group with her expertise.



>>> CEG ORNAMENTALS

The CEG Ornamentals discussed recent studies on Plant Growth Regulators (PGRs), which were conducted in several European countries. Ms Elisabeth Götte (Pflanzenschutzdienst NRW, Germany) and Mr Marc Vissers (Proefcentrum Sierteelt PCS, Belgium) provided an overview of a survey outcome regarding the control of thrips and soil-borne diseases.

>>> CEG HERBS & SPICES

During the CEG Fresh Herbs and Spices meeting, 3 presentations were given by representatives of national research bodies specialised in herb production and protection: Iteipmai (France), the Hungarian Herbal Association (Hungary), and the Herbs & Spices Minor Uses Sub-group of the AK-Lück (Germany). The meeting also covered the extrapolation process regarding plant protection product residues, as well as current PPP solutions available to be used in herbs and spices production.

>>> CEG SEEDS

Ms Camille Guerin (France) provided an extensive update on the needs and available active substances in seed production.

Mr. Jürgen Kohl and Ms. Georgina Elena from the <u>Wageningen</u> <u>University</u>, presented the latest research results on beneficial microorganisms for ensuring seed health.



>>> PLENARY SESSION

In accordance with MUCF experts' wishes, the Facility arranged a plenary session to present various views on the <u>Sustainable Use</u> <u>Regulation</u>, which was then to be voted on by the European Parliaments in November 2023. Representatives from several stakeholders, including Euroseeds, International Biocontrol Manufacturers Association (IBMA), Copa*Cogeca, and CropLife Europe, presented their perspectives on the Regulation and the various implications of its implementation for their future work.

On November 22, 2023, the European Parliament voted against implementing the Sustainable Use Regulation (with 299 votes against, 207 in favour, and 121 abstentions).

>>> HEG

During the HEG meeting, the MUCF presented the main outcomes of the 2022 MUCF survey, dedicated to minor uses regulatory procedures and hurdles, and provided an activity update for 2023, and a work outlook for 2024. Next work steps to be taken to draft a simplified draft Registration Report part A template for article 51 applications (according to Regulation (EC) 1107/2009) was elaborated and unmanned aerial spray systems in agriculture were discussed.



>>> COMMON SESSION

At the common session Mr. Marc Muszinski (Syngenta Germany, behalf of the German Industry Association presenting on https://www.iva.de), provided a bottleneck-analysis overview detailed per crop and pest illustrating the decrease in chemical control options during the last decade at the level of crop + pest + mode of action. The database tool (in German) to conduct the bottleneck analysis developed and is maintained the was by German Dienstleistungszentrum Ländlicher Raum Rheinpfalz (DLR). The tool provides an overview of the number of registered active substances and allows the search to be refined for specific crops and pest.

>>> REEG:

The recently established ReEG held its inaugural meeting in Athens after finalising its Terms of Reference during the Spring meeting 2023. This expert group aims to explore potential new MRL extrapolation possibilities. The focus of the discussions was the procedure for setting MRLs, ongoing residue extrapolation projects in Spain on citrus and mango, as well as proposals for future projects.





>>> FIELD TRIP

MUCF experts visited a minor crops production facility: the Kitantzis Plants & Supplies ornamentals nursery in Marathon. The company has been involved in the Floriculture and Agriculture industry in Greece since 1964 and is now the leader of the floriculture sector in the country.

We extend our gratitude to Konstantinos Kitantzis, Ioannis Kitantzis, and the entire nursery team for welcoming us and providing an informative guided tour of their facility, and on the measures they implemented to control harmful organisms.

>>> CEG MUSHROOM

On October 10th, the CEG Mushrooms held an online meeting to discuss newly established research trials in France, the Netherlands, and the United Kingdom. The trials aim to test plant protection solutions against bacterial blotch disease, sciarid flies, and other mushroom pests and diseases.

>>> CEG HOPS

The CEG Hops experts held their meeting in Nürnberg, Germany, on November 27th. The meeting was hosted by the <u>Barthhass Company</u>.

They discussed key topics related to hops' production and protection, including Verticillium diseases, downy mildew, exceptional weather conditions leading to higher pest pressure (especially for aphids), and spider mites.

We would like to express our gratitude to the Barthhaas company for hosting the meeting and for the opportunity to visit their brewery.

It currently contains information for 12 countries, with the objective of gathering and incorporating data from additional countries in the coming years.
